"Commissioning a piece of art should feel exciting, not overwhelming."

I've put together this simple 10-point checklist to streamline the process and make it less daunting. Whether you're a first-time buyer or a seasoned collector, these steps will help you feel confident about commissioning something truly personal.

- 1. Clarify Your Intent Decide what the artwork should express and highlight which existing pieces from the artist's portfolio resonate with you.
- 2. Select the Right Artist Choose someone whose style and vision align with your taste and the atmosphere you want to create.
- 3. Have a Conversation Arrange a Zoom or face-to-face meeting so the artist can understand your personality, values, and preferences.
- 4. Share Your Space Provide details of where the piece will hang: colours, décor style, dimensions, and photos of the room.
- 5. Discuss Scale & Medium Agree the size, surface, and medium so the artwork feels proportionate and harmonious.
- 6. Be Clear on Budget Open discussion on investment helps set the right expectations.
- 7. Trust the Process Allow creative freedom, with written progress updates instead of images at each stage.
- 8. Agree Timelines A typical commission takes 4–6 weeks, including creation, finishing, and drying time.
- 9. Confirm in Writing A simple agreement covering scope, costs, payment structure, and delivery protects both sides.
- 10. Plan the Presentation Consider framing, placement, and lighting to showcase the work at its best.
