The Process

The City of Loveland commissions local artists to paint original designs on city transformer boxes throughout the city. This program has been active for many years with over 100 boxes being painted. I was commissioned to paint a transformer box located in front of Redemption Church on 7th Street and Cleveland. I involved our community in the design through the use of handprints. Using several designated public work days, myself and support staff painted hundreds of hands to create a textured and layers affect to the simple design.

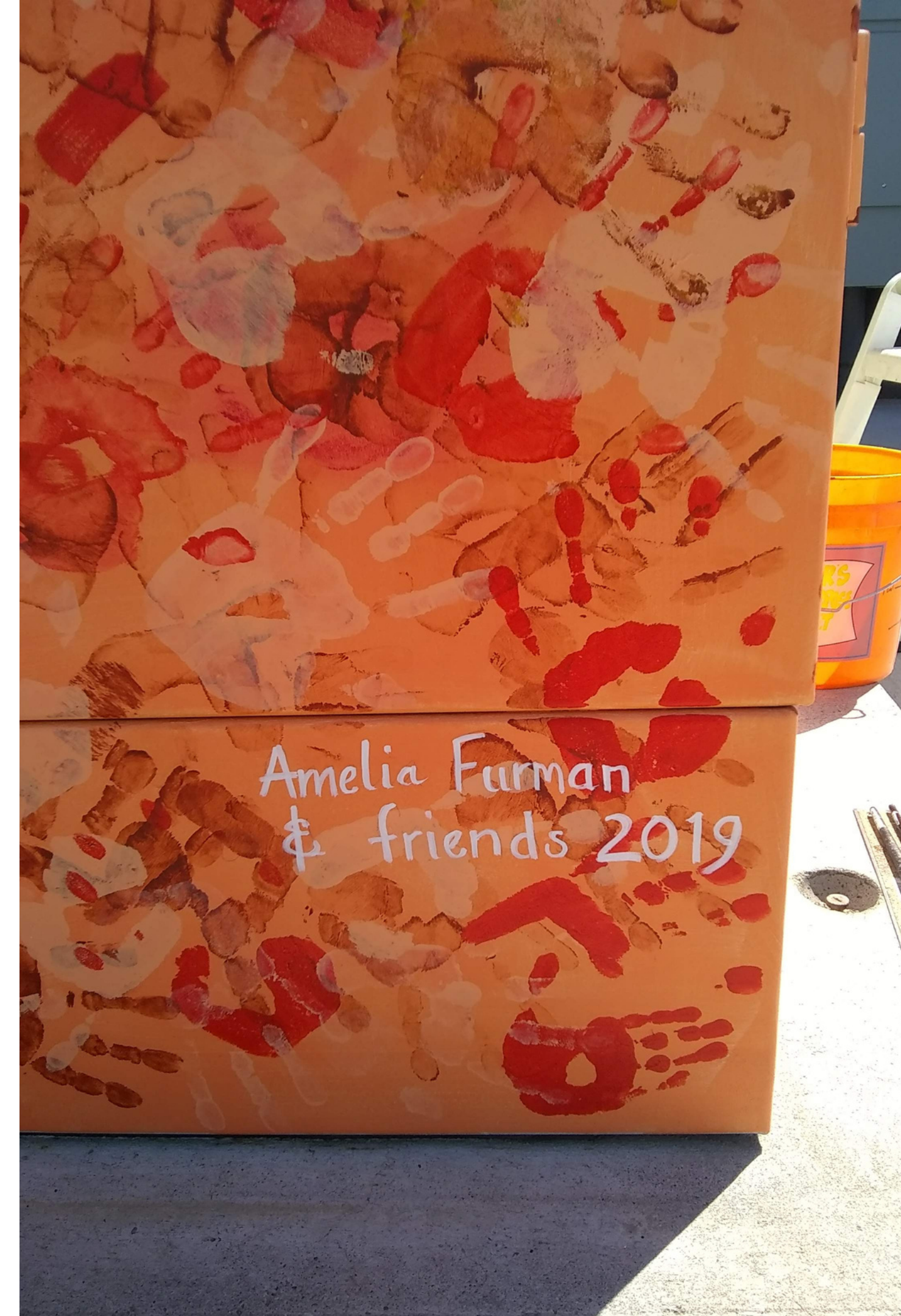


The Purpose of the Project
